MASCOT'S STORY

1.1 INNSBRUCK 2012 MASCOT'S STORY

Yoggl, our Alpine chamois, lives in the steep, rocky mountains which tower above the Youth Olympic venues Innsbruck, Seefeld and Kühtai. His name, Yoggl (pronounced like "YOG"), is based on the typical Tyrolean nickname "Joggl", which is short for Jakob, a very common name in the Tyrol. Yoggl is the compound of this nickname and the acronym of the Youth Olympic Games, YOG.

The chamois represents the way of life and the landscape of the host region, and his colourful pixel outfit merges traditional style with modern elements. Yoggl's sporty appearance reflects the athletic aspect of the Games, and his youthful character will spark the enthusiasm of young people from all over the world for the 1st Winter Youth Olympic Games and the Olympic Values of Friendship, Respect and Excellence. But above all, Yoggl the mascot is a lucky charm for all athletes and a vivid example of the Innsbruck 2012 motto: "Be part of it!"



SIGNATURE POSES

2.1 SIGNATURE POSES

The mascot depicted in its Signature Pose. This pose is the default depiction of the mascot and is to be used for the majority of mascot applications. It is recommended that the mascot's name is featured in combination with the Signature Pose, especially when the mascot is being introduced for the first time. There are two recommended placements for the mascot's name, as depicted below. The name can be featured in black, white or Yoggl's dominant colour, blue. Please refer to the colour definitions when applying the mascot's names in colour. Artworks have been provided for the name the various colours.








2.2 COLOUR GUIDE

The following is a guide for use in reproductions of coloured versions of the mascot in its signature poses. In all instances, pantone colours serve as the primary reference point. The accompanying processed colours (CMYK) are also acceptable colours to be used depending on production methods and formats. When in doubt, always follow the pantone colours.







2.3 SIZING

When the mascot is measures 8 centimetres or more in height, the Innsbruck 2012 Youth Olympic Games emblem (incl. wordmark and YOG DNA Label) must be featured in entirety. When the mascot measures between 5 and \langle 8 centimetres in height, only the wordmark may be featured. When the mascot measures 2 to \langle 5 centimetres in height, the emblem must be omitted. In these instances, the scale version of Yoggl should be used. The minimum recommended size for use of the mascot is 2 centimetres in height. All above measurements shall take reference from the Yoggl's full height. Artworks for all three sizes of the mascot have been provided and must not be altered in any way.



2.4 CLEAR SPACE

In order to ensure the completeness and integrity of the mascot's images, it is recommended that a minimum clear space equivalent to 10% of the full height be maintained. The height is taken from the lowest to the highest point of the design, as depicted below. It is recommended that no other elements, graphics, texts or otherwise infringe this clear space. However, discretion may be exercised to leave room for design creativity. If in doubt, consult IYOGOC for design approval.



2.4 USAGE OF PARTIAL MASCOT

Usage of the partial mascot is allowed provided that the integrity of the mascot's design is not compromised. When using the mascot partially, the general application guidelines and principles similar to those relating to the Signature Poses apply. In applications where the emblem and/or wordmark cannot be shown clearly and/or in entirety, the version of Yoggl without emblem and wordmark and the scale version of Yoggl may be used instead. However, discretion may be exercised to leave room for design creativity. If in doubt, consult IYOGOC for design approval.






APPLICATION

3.1 APPLICATION OF THE MASCOT IN GREYSCALE

This version may be used in black-and-white applications. Artworks for all three sizes of the mascot have been provided and must not be altered in any way. The name "Yoggl" is to be featured in black.



3.2 APPLICATION OF THE MASCOT IN LINEART

This version is to be used on a limited basis, such as for applications where colour and greyscale versions are inappropriate (for example, etching on metal or rubber stamp design). Artworks for all three sizes of the mascot have been provided and must not be altered in any way. The name "Yoggl" is to be featured in black.



3.3 APPLICATION OF MASCOT IN WHITE OUTLINE

A version of the mascot in white outline is available for discretionary application on dark backgrounds. This artwork must not be altered in any way. However, the colour of the names may be changed where applicable, taking reference from the Colour Guide for the name (see page 7).

ALTERNATIVE POSES

4.1 ALTERNATIVE POSES

The mascot is featured in two alternative poses. A version of these poses with a white outline for application on dark backgrounds is available. When using the alternative poses, the minimum size from the highest to the lowest point of the design is 2 cm. A minimum clear space equivalent to 10% of the full height must be maintained.




